CQC INSPECTION

The practice had its first ever CQC inspection on 5th March and we are currently awaiting the result. It seemed to go well and we are very grateful for all those patients who took the time to complete feedback forms for the inspectors and to the members of the Patient Participation Group who donated their time during the inspection to discuss the group with the inspectors. We are hoping to keep the surgery as de-cluttered as it is now for the future – but are not making any promises! Once we have the result, we will publish it on the website (not our idea but a contractual requirement) and I think there will be a poster somewhere obvious (or not so obvious depending on the result).

Electronic Prescribing Service

You can change your preferred provider simply by asking the newly preferred chemist to alter the registration on the computer system.

If your repeat medication list is changed either by the hospital or the practice, please let your chemist know so that stopped drugs are not requested again. This will help the practice reduce any prescribing errors.

In April, there was a problem with the NHS Spine for two days and all EPS scripts were lost in cyberspace. We thought they would be there when the spine started working again but sadly not. We have asked to be notified of any future problems with the Spine and will print tokens with all EPS scripts so that this does not happen again. This was out of our control.
